SYC is making plans not to be back in session until fall. This will require them to make some refunds. They hope to continue to pay the teachers. They will be drawing down reserves and will not need funds from the church. Many of Red Oak's kids are homeschooled making it easier for them to continue some instruction. The ministers have been working on all the details of providing service and activities online. Tech requirements have been challenging. UU Cares is a buddy system to pair up folks who others who want to stay in communication. Nineteen people have signed up so far. Churches have taken a variety of approaches to going online. First UU established a comprehensive program to provide church support every day while the lock down lasts. 178 people logged in to the first online Sunday service. Marian thanked Caroline for leading the service.111 people have signed into the Discord channel. Marian has communicated with the minsters of large UU congregations. Allie thanked the UU ministers, staff and volunteers for their work to adapt to the lock down.

Lisa was able to meet with the task force and sent out requests for feedback from numerous staff. The review is on schedule.	
Financing for the roof project Interest rates have gone down. The committee had selected Kemba for the loan we need and wrote a check. The Huntington has a rate that is lower than the Kemba rate. The Huntington offer would save the church \$2000 per year over the Kemba rate. There was discussion of the details of both loans, which Allie provided for review. Allie recused herself from the vote because she works with Huntington. Lisa led the voting process. Seth made a motion to proceed with the Huntington loan and to fall back to Kemba if there is a problem with Huntington. Larry seconded. The vote was unanimous with Allie abstainingl. Brian indicated that the contractor could start sooner than originally anticipated.	Allie Laura Lisa
