

Caregiver Peer Support Groups

Dates: Sundays at 9:30am

About: Self selected opportunities to identify and connect with other parents / caregiver.

Spirit Play (Ages 3-7 and 8-11)

A Montessori-based curriculum, begins in a circle to hear a story followed by individual work time that can include a range of expressive activities to explore what they are learning and to build connections with other children. It is a great class for active kids, as well as those who love to sit still and work on craft projects.

Our Whole Lives (Ages 5-7)

Our first level of comprehensive sexuality education. In K-1 OWL, through age appropriate stories, activities and games, we cover: bodies and proper names for body parts, families and feelings, how to keep ourselves safe and consent, gender identity and how people are made. This is an 8 week program that students will attend instead of their Spirit Play class. There is a Fall and Spring session.

Our Whole Lives (Ages 10-11)

Our second level of comprehensive sexuality education. In 5th-6th grade OWL, we cover: the changes that bodies make going from child to adult, healthy relationships, how to keep ourselves safe, consent, and how to find accurate information, among other topics. This is an 11 week program that students attend instead of Spirit Play or Neighboring Faiths. There is a Fall and Spring session.

Neighboring Faiths (Ages 11-13)

Young people become better citizens by learning about other faith communities. Major world religions are introduced and discussed, then a field visit is taken to see what that worship looks like. We then discuss our experiences.

Youth Group (Ages 12-19)

Uses a shared ministry approach to having fun while figuring out themselves and the world. Meets 2nd and 4th Sundays after service, as well as several special events and activities.

Coming of Age (Ages 14-15)

Youth develop a basic expression of their faith and delve more deeply into what it means to be a Unitarian Universalist. At the completion of the program, youth are offered the opportunity to become members of First UU. Coming of Age requires commitment to attend regularly; attendance at two retreats, participation in a June worship service, and preparation of a faith statement are also required. This is a closed group beginning in October with no new participants added during the year. The class meets at 10:45am.

Small Group, Big Questions (Ages 15-19)

This group discusses Big Life Questions and members reflect on what they perceive the answers to be through thoughtful discussion. Through interacting with each other, the facilitators, and larger ideas, they revise and refine the views first explored in Coming of Age. This class meets through the Fall, then shifts to High School OWL in the Winter.

Our Whole Lives (Ages 15-19)

In High School OWL, we revisit previously covered topics of health, relationships, safety and sexuality in more detail and depth that reflects the participants maturity

Dinner with the Ministers for High School Seniors

Join our ministerial team in cooking a meal together and talking about joys and concerns. This is scheduled once in the Fall and once in the Spring on Sunday evening at 5:30pm.

Inter-Generational Camping

Families and individuals go to a state park campground 3-6 times a year. No packing into campsites. Biking, swimming, hiking, lots of food, s'mores, and campfire singing are included. Sites include running water, toilets, and electricity.
