STATEMENT OF PURPOSE OF FIRST UNITARIAN CHURCH Organized June 27, 1940

The congregation shall be known as the First Unitarian Church of Columbus.

It shall be affiliated with the American Unitarian Association.

Its covenant or bond of union shall be:
"In the love of truth and in the spirit of Jesus we unite for the worship of God and the service of man."

All who are seekers of the truth and lovers of man and wish to share with us in the quest of the good life, shall always be welcomed and received into the membership of this church, regardless of any theological opinions he may hold.

Any person of good moral character who is in sympathy with the ideals and purpose of the Unitarian Church, may become a member of this church by applying to the standing committee and being accepted by them.

The method of admission to membership shall be simply by signing this covenant in this book to be kept especially for that purpose.
