Our church leadership structure

Our congregation is governed by the Board of Trustees in partnership with staff. The Board of Trustees is nominated by the Nominating Committee and elected at the annual meeting of the congregation.

What the Moderator does

The Moderator presides over the business meetings and any special meetings of the church.

What the Board of Trustees do



The Board oversees all matters related to personnel and property. In the past, six Trustees were elected; two each year for a term of three years. This year, with the Board expanding from six to nine Trustees, we hope to elect three Trustees to three year terms, one Trustee to a two year term, and one Trustee to a one year term. The Board then elects a Board Chair, Vice-Chair, and Secretary. The Board also appoints a church Treasurer and an Assistant Treasurer. These five people along with the Church Moderator (also elected at the annual meeting) comprise the six officers of the church. There are ex-officio members of the Board as well. These are the Ministers, the Director of Administration, the Director of Religious Exploration, the immediate past Board Chair, and two youth representatives, selected by the youth to serve a one-year term. The open Board meetings are held monthly throughout the year.

What the Nominating Committee does

The Nominating Committee is composed of six elected members serving two year terms and the immediate past Chair of the Board of Trustees. The committee works throughout the year to identify engaged, thoughtful and energetic congregation members in good standing for consideration and election at the annual meeting. They select the Board of Trustee candidates, the Moderator, candidates for nominating, of whom three are elected. They may also nominate members of a search committee for a settled minister if needed.

Other church leadership roles

There are many opportunities for leadership outside of the Board, Nominating Committee, and Moderator roles. For example, First UU also has a Finance Committee and comptroller, as well as many teams working with the staff to help make church life happen: Worship, Membership, Stewardship, Safety, Justice Action Ministry, Religious Exploration, Audio Visual, Grounds, and more.

How long have you been associated with First UU?

I've been attending First UU since May 2023! The very first service my wife and I attended was a youth-led and bridging service. From then on out, I knew this was the place for me. How have you been involved in the congregation and/or the larger UU community?

I hope to support those who are already doing the proactive work (not reactive) when it comes to prioritizing the accessibility of our church and congregation.

How long have you been associated with First UU?

Why do you want to serve?



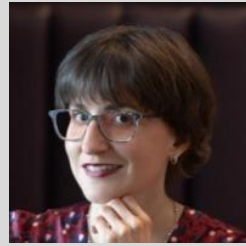

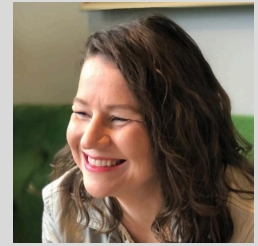

How have you been involved in the congregation and/or the larger UU community?

I have been an RE volunteer since fall 2024, and I love it. I currently assist Jen about twice a month in Spirit Play I. I regularly support First UU's democracy and justice actions--from voter registration to attending protests--as well as Feed and Read Ohio. In the past, I've participated in the Millennial Covenant Group.

I am active in the FUU Millennial Covenant Group. I attend church with my children twice per month. I work through the church on political activism.
